## Recipe of the Month

#### Perfect Breakfast Pizza

Make breakfast exciting with this delicious pizza recipe from the Oklahoma Beef Council.

PREP: 10 minutes COOK: 20 minutes SERVINGS: Serves 4

#### Ingredients:

1 lb. Fully cooked steak strips or fajita strips

1 prepared pre-baked pizza shell (12 inch)

1 can black beans, drained

1/3 cup salsa

4 eggs

1/2 cup tomatoes, seeded and chopped

1 Tbsp. Fresh jalapeno, chopped

1 cup Co-Jack cheese, shredded

1 Tbsp. Cilantro, chopped

Preheat oven to 450 degrees

In a skillet, scramble eggs. Set aside.

Heat beef strips according to package directions.

- Set aside 2 Tbsp. Black beans for garnish.
   In a small bowl, mash remaining beans with fork until smooth.
- Place pizza shell on cookie sheet and layer with mashed beans, salsa, scrambled eggs, steak strips, tomatoes, jalapenos and cheese. Top with cilantro and reserved whole beans.
- Bake at 450 degrees for 8-10 minutes or until cheese melts.
