NOTES FROM DIANNE

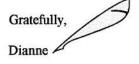

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Beef Taco & Cheese Pockets

Ingredients:

1 cup refrigerated fully cooked taco sauce with seasoned ground beef 1 cup frozen vegetable mixture, such as broccoli, corn and red peppers

3/4 cup shredded Mexican cheese blend or Cheddar cheese 1 package (17.3 ounces) refrigerated grand biscuit dough Cooking spray All-purpose flour

Instructions:

- 1. PLACE an oven rack in the center of the oven. HEAT oven to 375 degrees.
- PLACE the taco sauce with beef, vegetable mixture and cheese in a medium bowl. STIR with a fork to mix well.
- SPRAY a large baking sheet with cooking spray to coat it lightly.
- OPEN the biscuit dough package following the label directions.
- SPRINKLE a wooden board or clean countertop with flour to coat lightly. PLACE 1 biscuit on the floured
- RUB a rolling pin with flour to coat lightly. ROLL biscuit with rolling pin until you have a 7x4-1/2 inch oval piece of dough.
- 7. PLACE a heaping 1/4 cup of the beef mixture on one side of the dough oval. FOLD the other side of the dough over the filling to cover it.
- 8. PLACE the pocket on the baking sheet. FIRMLY press the edges of the dough together with the tips of the tines of a fork to seal the dough.
- REPEAT steps 6 through 8 to make a total of 8 pockets.
- 10. PLACE baking sheet on the rack in the center of 375degree oven. BAKE 13 to 15 minutes or until dough
- 11. REMOVE the baking sheet from the oven and place it on a wire rack. Carefully remove the pockets from the baking sheet with a metal spatula to serve. Makes 8 pockets.

NONPROFIT OFFERING LOW-COST MAMMOGRAMS IN OCTOBER

During the month of October, women can save money and possibly their lives.

Several mammography facilities in the Central Oklahoma area will take part in the Project Woman Coalition Low-Cost Mammography Campaign as part of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. The program is designed to make breast cancer screening and detection more affordable.

Participating facilities will be offering screening mammograms at reduced prices of \$80 for film screen mammograms and \$120 for digital.

This is a significant savings on a screening mammogram that is a crucial part of women's health. This coupon is valuable to many Oklahoma women because the price of mammography services can sometimes be too costly. Coupons are available at Panera Bread locations, at the participating mammography facilities, on the Project Woman Coalition Web site, and on McDonald's tray liners.

Annual mammograms are important because the earlier breast cancer is detected, the greater the chance of beating the disease. Early detection also allows for more treatment options. These are the reasons Project Woman Coalition exists.

In addition to providing the low-cost coupons, PWC is also teaming up with Panera Bread during the month of October. Panera Bread will be selling a cherry-flavored Pink Ribbon Bagel with 25 cents of every bagel sold going to PWC.

Project Woman Coalition is a nonprofit organization with a mission: to increase breast cancer awareness, provide access to screening and diagnostic services, and improve the breast health of Oklahoma women. PWC collaborates with area hospitals, mammography facilities, city, county and state agencies, community-based organizations, physicians, nurses, and breast cancer survivors in order to provide services and education.

PWC provides breast health services to Oklahoma women who are uninsured and have limited financial resources. These programs are supported by donations and grants from individuals, corporations, and foundations such as the Central Oklahoma Affiliate of the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation.
